EUROPEAN CODE FOR SMOKE-FREE HEALTH CARE SERVICES

1. Engage decision-makers. Appoint a working group and reject tobacco industry sponsorship.
2. Develop a strategy and an implementation plan. Inform all personnel, patients/residents and the community
3. Set up a training plan to instruct all personnel on how best to approach tobacco users.
4. Organise cessation support facilities for patients/residents in the organisation and ensure continuity of support after discharge.
5. Develop the organizations campus (grounds) to be tobacco free. If smoking areas remain, they should be clearly indicated.
6. Display clear tobacco free signage. Ban all incentives to smoke or use tobacco products
7. Develop personnel management policies and support systems to protect and promote the health of all personnel
8. Promote tobacco control activities in the community setting.
9. Renew and broaden information to maintain commitment to the policy. Ensure follow-up and quality assurance.
10. First convince, then constrain considering legislation if needed. Have patience!

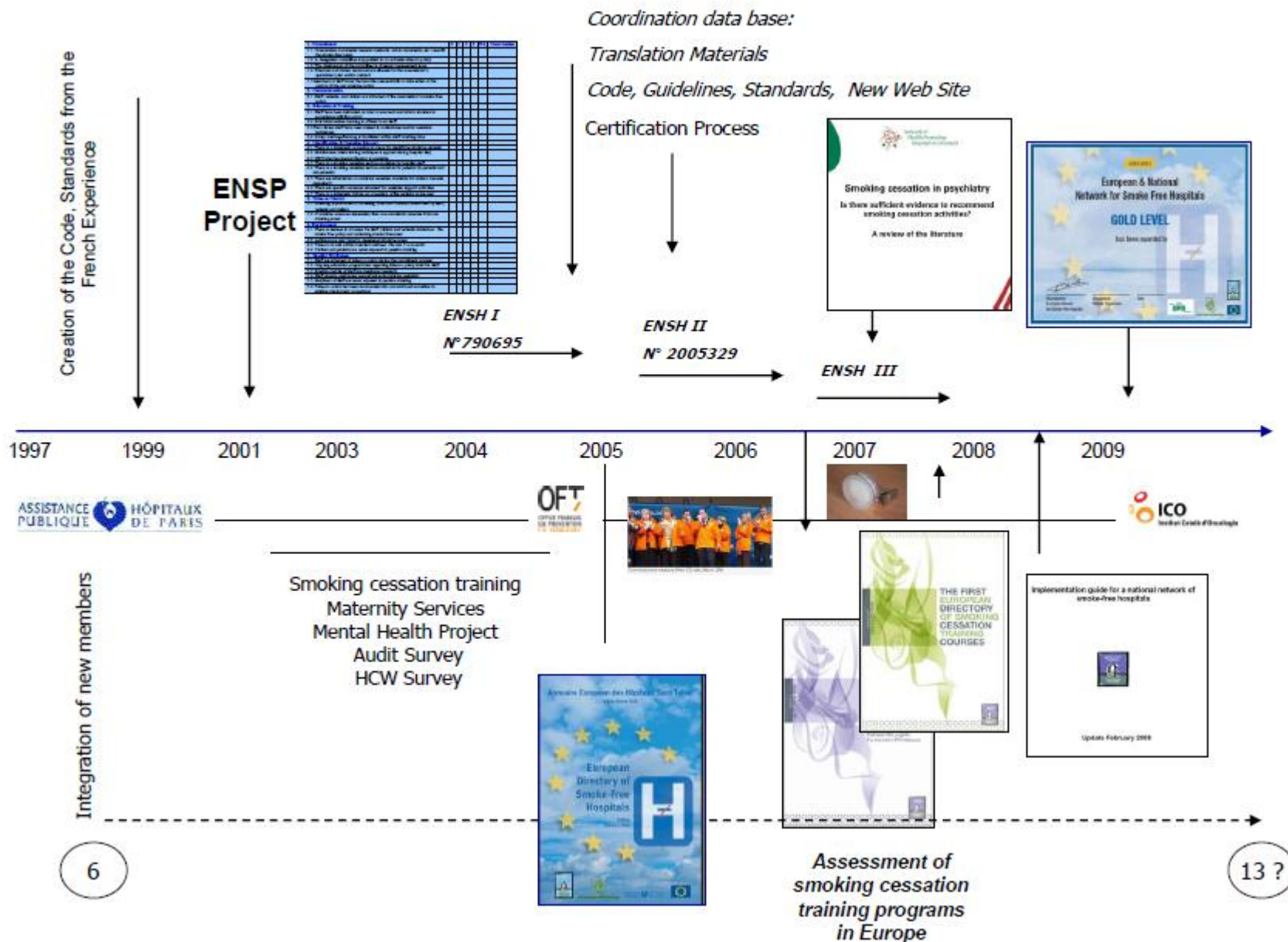

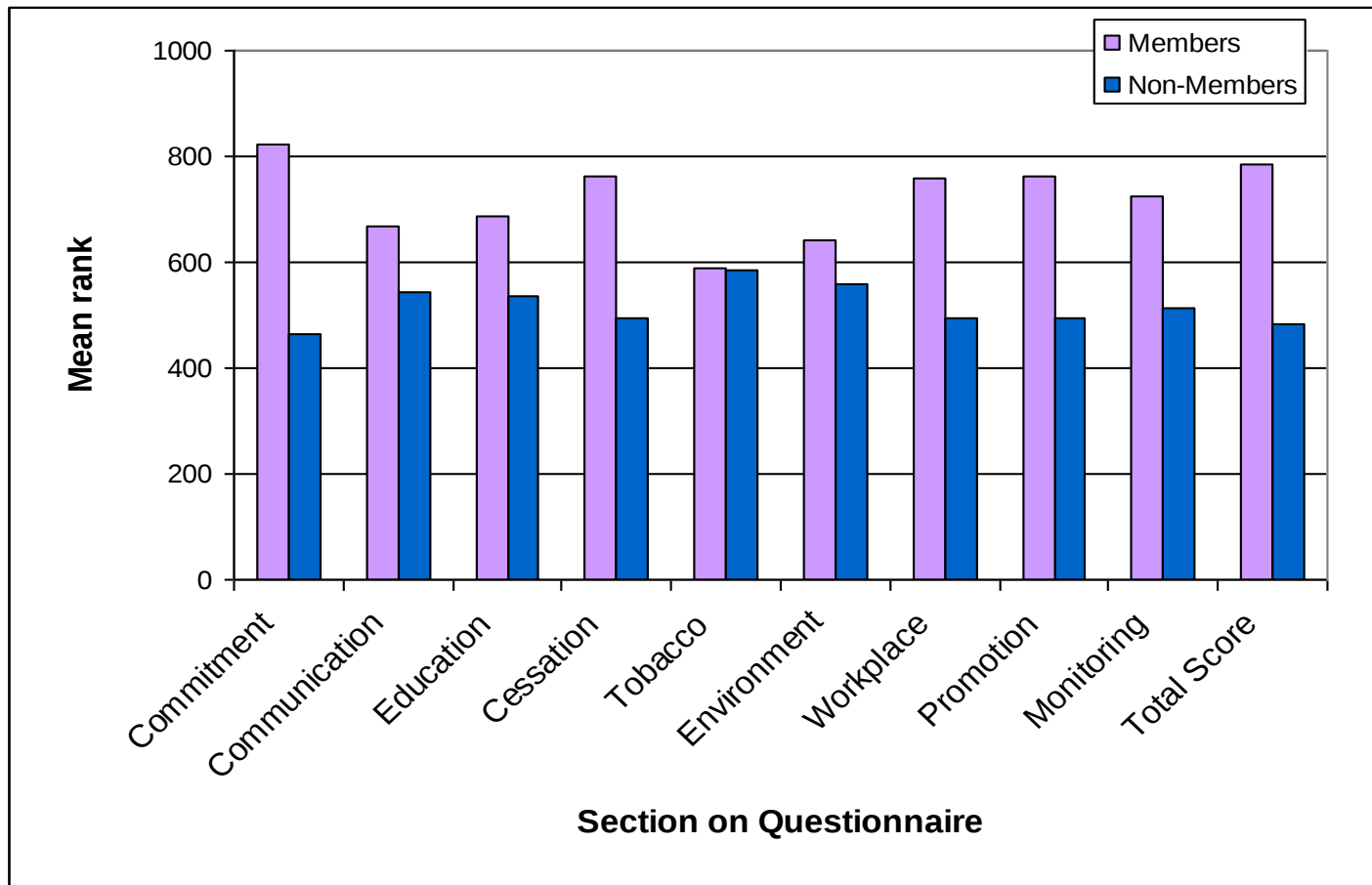
Review of the ENSH Project



ENSH Self-audit study in 2005

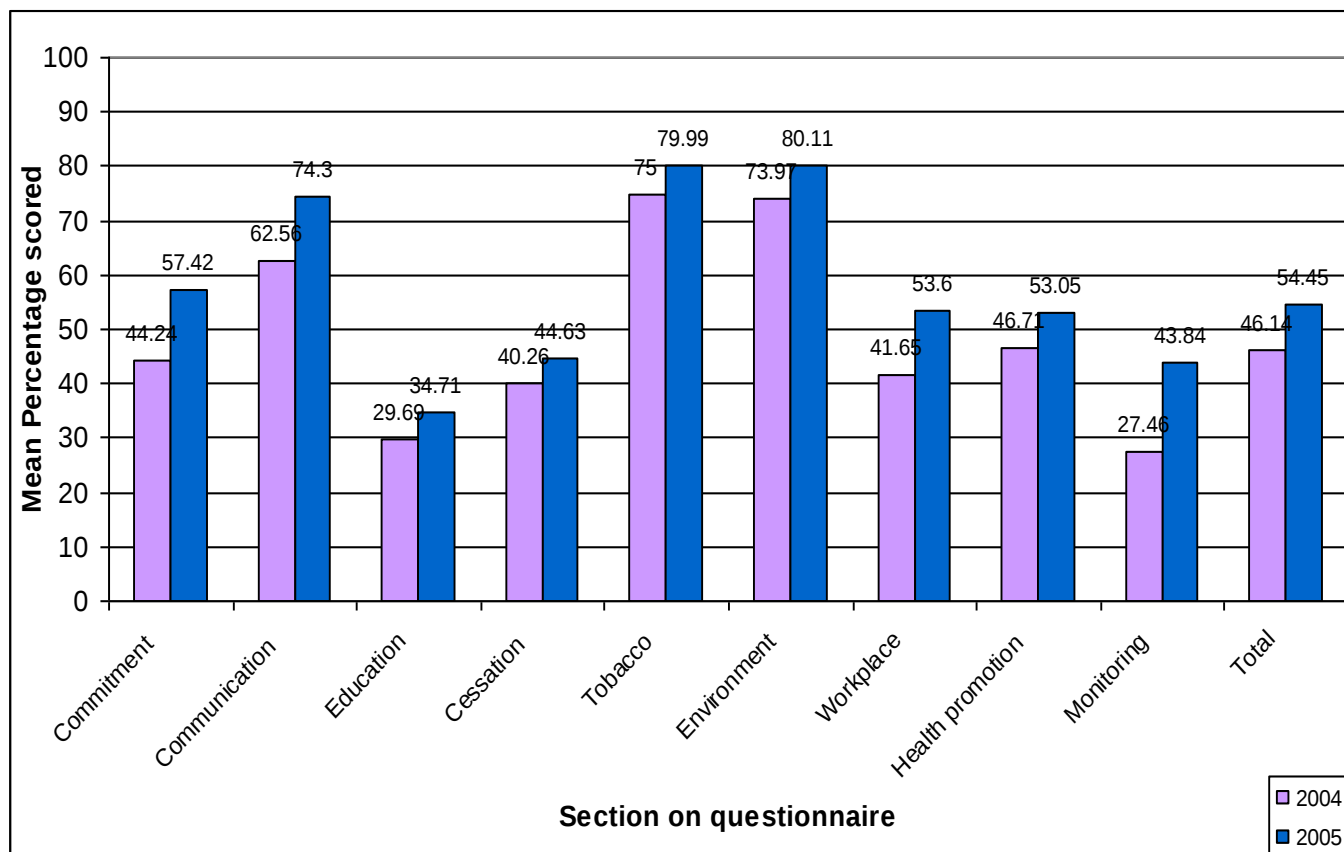
- The audit tool was completed by **1173 hospitals / clinics / nursing homes in 9 European Countries across 10 networks.**
 - **All organisations who were performing above the European median, were members of the ENSH.**

Comparison between ENSH members and non-members



- The difference in ranks was statistically significant on 8 areas of the audit tool (all areas except tobacco control and environment)

Comparison of mean percentage scores between 2004 and 2005 in 284 hospitals.



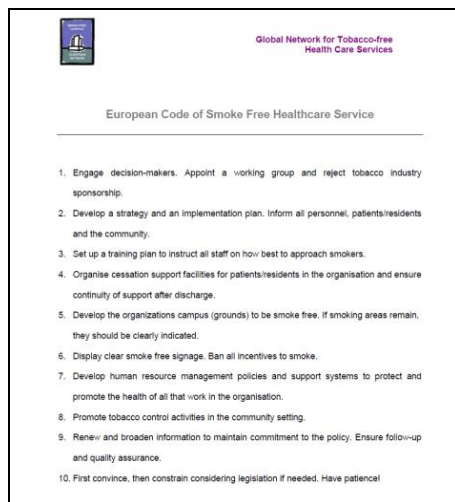
- Increase in mean percentage scores for all sections of the audit tool in 2005
- Substantial improvement in Commitment, Communication, Workplace and Monitoring.

- ❑ Tool is easy to use
 - ❑ Measures continuous quality improvement
 - ❑ Hospitals can monitor progress effectively using the tool
 - ❑ Significant Variance in smoke free practice in hospitals across Europe

ENSH-Global Concept

- ENSH-Global Code and Standards are integral in the implementation of the FCTC in order to eliminate the tobacco epidemic
 - Employing tobacco cessation efforts within health care services has become ever more relevant as the **WHO** has classified tobacco dependence as a disease (**ICD 10**)
-

The ENSH-Global Core Tools:



GOLD	The ultimate level: awaits final European definition. Currently is accepted as no smoking at all within hospital premises (indoor and outdoor).
SILVER	The third level: high level of implementation of European Code and Standards 1-9 for smoke-free hospitals. Grading Criteria: at least 76 points of total score, section 1-9 of the European Self Audit Questionnaire (achievement of bronze status is not a pre-requisite for this category). (at least 75%)
BRONZE	The second level: demonstrates hospital management commitment, activity of working group and communication of smoke-free policy. Grading Criteria: at least 14 points of the score for Sections 1+2 of the European Self Audit Questionnaire
MEMBERSHIP	The first level: definite expression of intent to progress towards the attainment of a Smoke-free Hospital environment. Grading Criteria: completes and returns the European Self Audit Questionnaire and a signed Letter of Commitment by Management Team.

1.2 The healthcare organisation does not accept any sponsorship from the tobacco industry.				
1.3 A policy working group or committee is designated to coordinate the development, implementation and monitoring of the tobacco-free policy.				
1.4 A senior manager has responsibility for the actions of the policy working group or committee.				
1.5 Financial and human resources are allocated in the healthcare organisation's operational plan and/or contract to implement and monitor the tobacco-free policy.				
1.6 All staff understand their responsibility to take action in the implementation and management of the tobacco-free policy.				
Standard 2: Communication	No / Not implemented	Less than half implemented	More than half implemented	Yes / Fully implemented
2.1 All healthcare personnel (including teachers, students and transient staff) are informed of the organisations tobacco-free policy.				
2.2 All contract and outsourced employees working within or in direct contact with the healthcare organisation are informed of the tobacco-free policy.				
2.1 All patients/residents (in and out-patients) are informed of the healthcare organisation's tobacco-free policy.				
2.2 Public is informed of the healthcare organisation's tobacco-free policy.				
Standard 3: Education & Training	No / Not implemented	Less than half implemented	More than half implemented	Yes / Fully implemented
3.1 Policy briefing/instruction is provided for all personnel on how to approach tobacco users and inform them of the organisations tobacco-free policy.				
3.2 Managers and clinical personnel are provided with mandatory policy briefings/ instruction.				
3.3 Brief intervention training is offered and available to all personnel.				
3.4 Key clinical personnel are trained in motivational and tobacco cessation techniques.

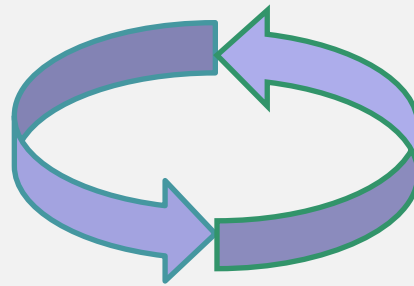

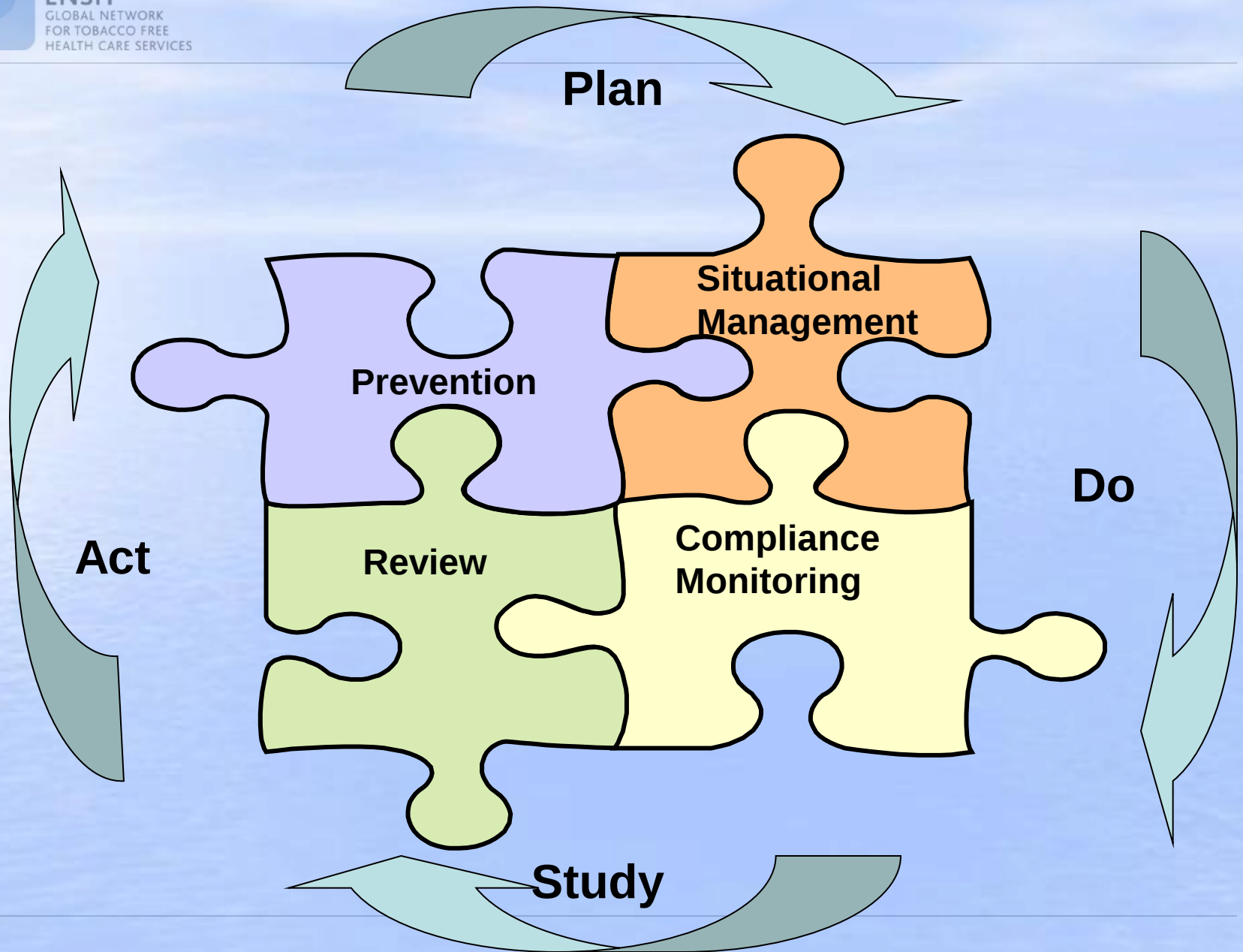
